This decorative embroidery design, which look like appliquéd lace, is embroidered with Bobbin Work. For this technique the decorative yarn is used as bobbin thread and it is sewn on the wrong side of the fabric.



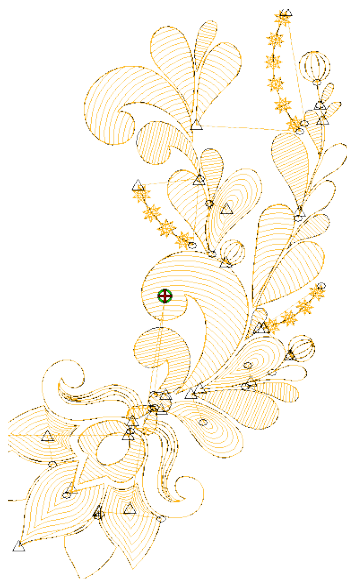
Fabric / Notions

- Suitable yarn for Bobbinwork
- Stabilizer
- BERNINA Bobbin Case for Bobbinwork (depending on the machine; see next page)

General Tips for Bobbin Work

What you need:

- The suitable bobbin case depending on the machine.
For 5.5 mm BERNINA machines (CB hook), the bobbinwork case with the black loop is used.
For 9 mm BERNINA machines with rotary hook, the use of a second standard bobbin case is recommended as bobbinwork case. Reduce the thread tension of this case manually with the screw driver, depending on the thread size.
For the BERNINA 7 Series and new 5 Series (BERNINA hook), the red bobbin case is inserted. For the BERNINA 8 Series, no special bobbin case is needed. The thread tension of the bobbin thread is reduced with a tool instead; please refer to the instruction manual.

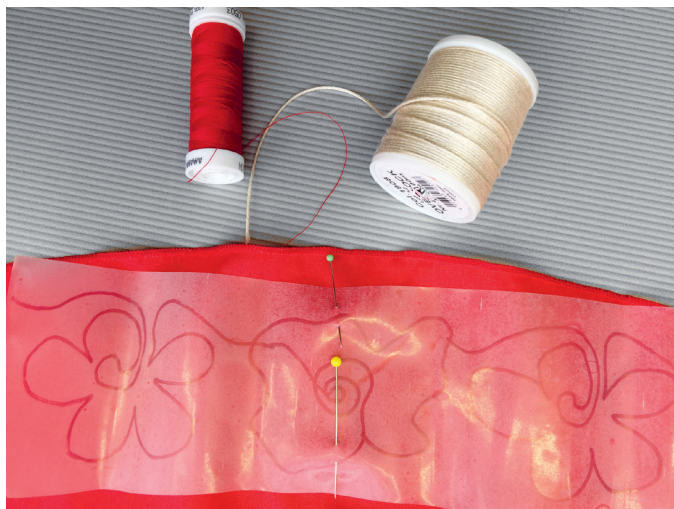


Preparation

Reduce the speed while winding the bobbin. Wind the yarn manually in counterclockwise direction if necessary. Do not use the thread cutter as it could get damaged by the metallic or the deco threads. Don't fill the bobbin too much. Insert the bobbin into the case and check the bobbin thread tension. Hold the thread end while doing so. If the thread cannot be unwound without pulling, the tension is okay. When having a soft fabric, place the stabilizer on the wrong side.

Embroidery

Increase the upper thread tension considerably and bring the bobbin thread up before starting to sew. Adjust the thread tension if necessary. Embroider slowly and evenly. When finished, pull the thread ends to the wrong side of the fabric and knot them.
